


A Mountain of Regulation?: Assessing Barriers to Work in West Virginia



Introduction:

Occupational licensing laws require the citizens of West Virginia to obtain a permission slip from Charleston to work. To obtain the permission slip, citizens must complete minimum levels of training and education, pay fees, pass exams, and meet additional entry requirements. Is occupational licensing presenting Mountaineers with an unnecessary mountain of regulation to climb to obtain employment? We compare occupational licensing requirements for 64 occupations in West Virginia to the bordering states of Ohio and Pennsylvania. Initial licensing fees, renewal fees, the number of exams required, continuing education requirements, and good moral character requirements are compared. We classify barriers as high if 3 or more occupational licensing requirements are higher in West Virginia than in both Ohio and Pennsylvania. We classify barriers as similar if 2 occupational licensing requirements are higher in West Virginia than in both Ohio and Pennsylvania. We classify barriers as low if 1 or no licensing requirement is higher in West Virginia than in both Pennsylvania and Ohio. We find that:

- 25 of the 64 compared occupations have high barriers in West Virginia.
- Initial licensing and renewal fees are more than 8% <u>higher in West Virginia</u> than in Ohio and Pennsylvania. In fact, initial licensing fees in West Virgina on average are more than double than Pennsylvania.
